In-Person Nursery Care Resumes

Nursery Care resumed on Sunday, November 1st, joining In-Person Sunday School which also started that same morning. Susan Powers, on behalf of the Staff Parish Relations Committee (SPRC), which handled details of the Nursery Care, reports: "Our nursery staff is excited to



resume their duties of caring for your little ones. Please read the details of our reopening plan below. Note that we are following our New York Annual Conference (NYAC) guidelines, which were developed in conjunction with the CDC and CT state guidelines to keep safety and well-being at the forefront of everything we do.

"Please know that these plans are subject to change, as this is a work in progress. We appreciate your patience and support.

Please do not hesitate to contact the church office with any concerns or questions."

Nursery Reopening Guidelines

- 1. We will encourage proper handwashing by staff and the children (with supervision).
- 2. We will encourage proper covering of coughs and sneezes.
- 3. We will provide hand sanitizer for use by all upon entering and exiting the nursery.
- 4. We will insist that you stay home if you are not feeling well.
- 5. We will insist that you stay home for 2 weeks upon return from any states on the CT Travel Advisor, which is updated weekly.
- 6. We will keep a nursery window and door open for proper ventilation and flow of outdoor air. A baby gate will be in place at the open nursery door for safety.
- 7. We will avoid unnecessary physical contact (NO shaking/holding hands, hugging, high fives, etc.)
- 8. We will take attendance each session and the attendance sheet will be housed in the church office for contact tracing purposes.
- 9. We will not allow any food.
- 10. We will sanitize all tables, toys and high-touch surfaces after each session.
- 11. Anyone over the age of 2 years will be required to wear a mask or other face covering while in the nursery.
- 12. We request that only one parent bring and retrieve their child to and from the nursery.

Remember to always keep the spirit of Christmas in your hearts, be kind to one another especially this year!


