Hello everyone,

Peace and grace to you during the Advent and Christmas season!

Advent is a word with Latin roots and means "coming." We use this period of time before Christmas to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth. It's also a time of repentance



and meditation while anticipating Jesus' second coming. Jesus is the light of the world and we light Advent candles to signify this. It's also a way to build anticipation for the celebration of the first coming of Jesus. Beginning on the fourth Sunday before Christmas and each Sunday leading up to Christmas Day, each family lights a candle and conducts a themed advent reading.

2020 was the year when Covid-19 disturbed and afflicted our homes and the world more than any other year. Even now, the number of patients and deaths is increasing exponentially. I hope that the Lord, who overcame all the sins and the power of death in the world 2000 years ago, will come back to our lives and defeat the evil spirits and forces of death and become a new life full of hope, joy, peace and love. Our Bishop Thomas Bickerton and Cabinet members of the New York Annual Conference are praying that our churches and members will be healthy and safe. They recommend as follows:

- 1. Over the last two months, over 20 churches in the New York Annual Conference have re-opened only to close again due to an outbreak of Covid-19 within the church.
- Guidelines for singing in public venues have not changed at all. There is to be no singing indoors. Any solo/special music performed must be at a distance of 12 feet. Any outdoor singing must be done with masks and with appropriate social distancing observed.
