Message from Pastor

Look for the Lost Sheep!

"Which one of you, having a hundred sheep and losing one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the wilderness and go after the one that is lost until he finds it?" (Luke 15:4)



A long time ago, a man was tried in Australia for stealing

sheep and raising it at his house. He pleaded not guilty to the police officers, claiming that the amount was a lost amount a long time ago. Eventually, the case brought the man to court. After the judge was wondering how to make a judgment, he brought the sheep into the court. Then the judge asked the defendant to call the sheep. However, the sheep did not respond to the call at all, but rather became more nervous and afraid. Then the judge sent the sheep outside again and asked the defendant to call the sheep again. The defendant called the sheep again loudly. Then the sheep heard his voice and instinctively jumped into the courtroom. The sheep heard the owner's voice and ran to the owner. Only then did it prove that the sheep belonged to the defendant, and he was acquitted and went back home with his sheep.

The owner who lost the sheep thinks of the sheep as his own child, takes care of it, and searches for it when he loses it. I sometimes see flyers looking for pets. Some people say they lost their dog and others say they lost their cat. Some people even say they will give a big gift. Until I raised a pet myself, I didn't know why they would look for a dog or a cat like that. But as I raise pets, they are not just animals, but they are considered my biological children.

Last spring, I lost my beloved dog 'Cola', who I lived with for 15 years. A bear living in the area came down with her cubs and passed by my backyard and bit Cola when she approached them. She was seriously hurt and eventually died. Having lost Cola was like losing my biological daughter, I have missed her for months. And sometimes when I see a dog that looks similar, I fall into the illusion that it's Cola. Pets are no different from our own children.

The pain of losing a pet is big, but if you lost your child, how painful would it be? Jesus teaches us the heart of the shepherd who lost the sheep and the heart of the father of heaven through the metaphor of the lost sheep. If you lose a sheep, you wander around the mountains and fields all day to find the sheep, and when you find it, you return with joy and have a big feast with your friends. The party costs may be higher than sheep ransom. However, you have a big feast at a higher cost. This heart is the heart of God Father and of Jesus.

I came to our church during the pandemic. And at a time when the pandemic turns into an endemic and returns to normal little by little, I think of our church members who have not been able to attend the service in person. Pandemic and the transition of pastors make me think of our church members who could not actively attend worship and activities. Starting with this Lent, I hope we will find our lost friends of faith, be friends of prayer, and connect with each other to gain the joy of finding them again. I hope that each person will be a prayer friend, so that our church will be restored to a community of love.


