GO AFTER LOST SHEEP

Jesus often ate and socialized with sinners and tax collectors. Then the Pharisees and scribes accused Jesus

of being in touch with the sinners. Jesus told them the parable of a shepherd going for a lost sheep in order to teach them why he should socialize with sinners. Jesus said that finding sinners was his purpose in the world. It also emphasizes that it is our mission to find sinners, and lost sheep.

Who is the lost sheep in our church? "Lost sheep" refers to a person who does not attend worship service regularly or church

activities or class meetings. Sometimes, we call them as 'VIP.' 'VIP' means literally 'very important person.' In general, the most important person is the pastor or the lay leader who devotes a lot to the church. But, in our class meeting, 'VIP' is an inactive member or a newcomer. So we focus on VIPs first at the church.

The class leader and members should be the first person to go after them, expressing that they have been missed, asking if they are doing okay, and asking if they are willing to come back to the church. The class members should again ask the person how they are doing, express that they have been missed, and indicate that the group hopes they will be able to return. If they are unwilling to return to church, the leader cannot force them to come. The class members should never be like some telemarketers who refuse to take no for an answer and call repeatedly. Our purpose is not to harass people. And we should always respect people's decisions, even if we are grieved by them. Some people might find it hard to accept, but this is in keeping with God's own posture toward us. The basic purpose of following up with forks who miss a meeting is simply to let them know they were missed.

One of the reasons people often begin to distance themselves from a group is because they do not feel as if their presence is significant. The purpose of the class meeting is to keep in touch with all of you who are lost for a week and take care of each other.

From the first Sunday of October, the class meetings that we've been preparing for will begin. We hope that our faith will mature, and the church will grow by going after the lost sheep, and also by watching over one another and strengthening our relationship with God.
