
GIVE, AND IT WILL BE GIVEN TO YOU!

"Give, and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap. For the measure you give will be the measure you get back." (Luke 6:38)

Last Sunday, I was struck fresh by a child. She sold apple cider to support the church's finances and those who fight with cancer. I couldn't believe that a child, only in the first grade of elementary school, was raising money. So I asked her parents, "Did you guys make this happen?" And they said, "No. she wants to do it." This is not the first time, but she has already done it seven times at home, street, or at school. Last summer, I heard that she sold lemonade in front of her house in hot weather.

I thought her heart was from God, not from parents or teachers. Jesus said, "You cannot come to heaven unless you are like a child." Watching Averie reminded me of the miracle of five loaves and two fish. Jesus asked Philip to get meals for about 5,000 people. He couldn't get bread in the wilderness and needed about 200 denarions (\$20,000), but he had no money. He said to Jesus, "I can't do anything."

But this time, Andrew took a child with him to Jesus and said, "Here are five loaves and two fish. But I don't know if it's enough to feed all these people." Jesus didn't tell Andrew that it was "too little." When he took the bread, thanked God, and distributed it to the people, over 5000 people ate and 12 baskets left.



Sometimes adults' reasonable knowledge prevents God's grace and gives up in advance. But we sometimes need a child-like pure heart and thoughts that inspire children, too. Not our knowledge and experience, but when we put ours down and give something small with a pure heart like a child, the blessing to be fuller and share comes to us. November 19th is Pledge Sunday. We must remember the grace God has given us with Thanksgiving and give our gifts to God with our gratitude and faith in protecting our lives and health and taking care of our homes and workplaces in the New Year.

Our budget of our church is currently short about \$30,000 a year. About 70 families donate offerings to our church. If a family contributes about \$400 a year, our finances will be covered. If we eat out, it costs about \$25 per person. If you sacrifice eating out once a month and donate money to the church like a child, our church's finances will be better. With the same feeling as a child, when you give something small to Jesus, you will be filled with greater grace. Jesus said, "Give, and it will be given to you; good measure, pressed down, shaken together, running over, will be put into your lap." Through giving and sharing, may you taste and experience the miracle of five loaves and two fish in your life.
