PRESS ON TOWARD THE GOAL!

Brothers and sisters, I do not consider that I have laid hold of it, but one thing I have laid hold of forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

Famous French novelist, Consuel Saint-Exupery (1900-1944) told a story as follows. An airplane that was crossing the continent crashed into the vast desert due to engine failure and lack of fuel. Soon all passengers were in danger of losing their lives due to the lack of food and drinks in the middle of the desert, where the sun was blazing. They decided to look in all directions in groups of people to ask for help. They looked for miles in different directions, but it was in vain. Days passed by. They had to take more daring steps, seized by the fear of death.

One day, they set fire to the wreckage of the plane and eliminated the target of returning to the scene of the disaster. Fortunately, they split up and found a village. If they found it, they would live, if they didn't, they would die. They agreed to die in the desert. After making this decision, when they desperately tried for their life, they finally found a village, and all the passengers came to live. A new horizon of life can be seen even when the line connected to the past is boldly cut off.



If you look at today in the sense that it is the result of yesterday, you cannot ignore the past at all. However, this past should not be allowed to dominate today's life. Some people always keep in mind the difficult and miserable things and mistakes of the past, and cannot get out of regret and blame, saying, 'If I didn't do that then, I wouldn't have been like this.' We should learn the wisdom of living today boldly without being tied to the past.

St. Paul said to the Philippians, "Brothers and sisters, I do not consider that I have laid hold of it, but one thing I have laid hold of: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal, toward the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.
