CARE OF THE PARSONAGE

The Board of Trustees determined the Parsonage needed some attention for safety and preventive reasons. A very large tree on the back side of the house was trimmed removing many branches that were above the roof. Branches from three trees in front of the house which were near the roof were also trimmed. In addition six trees were cut down at no cost to us. The roof was replaced as many of the shingles were curling.

This work was completed in October after the Trustees negotiated very reasonable prices. In addition we have obtained a sticker from the City of Bristol for an outdoor barrel for the removal of brush and small branches as the town picks up yard waste every week from April to the beginning of December. We are now looking into pest control companies to service the house and property. For security, lamps with timers were put on the first and second floors and we are putting in an entry keypad.
